This piece of orange cloth  
represents our commitment to this work.  
Let it symbolize both the memory of those who suffered  
and our dedication to a future of healing.

When you feel ready,  
come forward and tie your cloth onto the cross.  
As you tie it, offer a silent prayer—  
whether it is a prayer for healing, for justice, or for your own  
growth in understanding and reconciliation.
